

Guest Speaker: Ruby Javed

"One pill can kill."

"He was hanging out with the wrong crowd," says Ruby Javed, telling the story of her childhood and how losing her brother to substance abuse affected her and continues to leave a lasting impact on her today.

"Grieving comes with the loss of anything close to your heart... it's not easy at all, but it's a part of life, and it's something you'll always have to deal with." Ruby Javed tells the students, substance abuse is one of the leading factors in young adult, teenage, child, and even infant death. From teens being pressured by their "friends" into taking drugs, or children accidentally consuming drugs that are left out in the open, in Ruby's words, "drug deaths are overtaking the nation, [...] and this is happening so fast that we can't even keep up."

Illegally-produced fentanyl is one of the quickest killers of all drugs, and drug overdose deaths have become more dangerously prominent. According to Ms. Javed, it only takes **0.2 milligrams** of fentanyl to suffer possibly fatal consequences, and when fentanyl is mixed with other chemical compounds, it may only take **0.02 milligrams** of consumption to **kill someone.** To make matters worse, fentanyl is often hidden, mixed in with other drugs, and made to look like prescription fentanyl or colorful candy.



50% of accidental deaths are at the hands of drugs and alcohol. Fentanyl distributions have caused more deaths, especially in teenagers, than ever before and continue to be on the rise, as fentanyl can be disguised as real prescription drugs, pills, and even candy.

Fentanyl has been severely on the rise since 2013 and is **one of the most fatal drugs** as of now. Ruby Javed's job is to investigate sudden,

violent, or strange deaths,

such as supposed natural causes after being found at home, where the deceased has not been seen by a physician within twenty days prior. She mentions having been met with many cases in this year alone of teenagers overdosing and even infants dying from accidental substance abuse. However, to combat fentanyl and other drug deaths, it's crucial that we educate the children and teens of today, spread awareness, and always keep our guard up.
