Campus Safety Notes

Hello Families,

Happy Friday!

Some notes from this week's campus safety weekly report. Please understand I have made these requests multiple times. It should not take a student or employee to get hit, or severely injured for us to work together for the common good of the SG community and our neighbors.

- **U-turns:** Please do NOT make u-turns it is simply a safety concern.
- **Right Turns:** Please do NOT make a right turn from Hazeltine onto Community St (including on evening days of school).
- Lane Driving: Please do NOT Drive through from lane to lane. If you go to the wrong one on accident for safety concerns, please drop off in that lane and proceed out of the lane back into traffic.
- **Pull all the way forward:** Please pull all the way forward and have the children ready to get out. This will help speed up the drop off process. Please do NOT stop halfway this blocks traffic behind you.
- **Fast Food:** Elementary and Middle School cannot have fast food dropped off. We will not accept it.
 - From Ms. Allen: Should your student need lunch please coordinate with Mr. Hike for food or drop off a home meal. In order to maximize learning in the classroom, we must maximum the healthy intake of food during the day. The food they consume directly affects their concentration and learning.
- Arriving Early: Please do NOT arrive 30-45 minutes early. We are asking for your cooperation on this because it affects our community and neighbors. We form long lines up the streets and block our neighbors' driveways. (Please if you block someone's driveway think about how you would feel if it happened to you?)
 - Neighborhood Watch called because neighbors complained that we don't move when blocking driveways. *Let's be Valiant and "treat others the way we want to be treated."*
